ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- | Less than 500 employees
 - | Operations in Genesee, Lapeer, Lenawee, Livingston, Macomb, Monroe, Oakland, Shiawassee, St. Clair, Washtenaw, or Wayne county
 - | Earn at least 10% annually of business revenues from the mobility sector currently or within the last 5 years*
- | Priority will be given to manufacturers in the ICE supply chain as well as those operating in regions positioned for market expansion and investment

**For those that do not have 10% annual revenue in mobility, manufacturers demonstrating the critical potential to address a particular need in the advanced mobility supply chains may also be eligible.*
